BOROUGH OF PARK RIDGE ORDINANCE NO. 2024-008

CALENDAR YEAR 2024 ORDINANCE TO EXCEED THE MUNICIPAL BUDGET APPROPRIATION LIMITS AND TO ESTABLISH A CAP BANK (N.J.S.A. 40A-4-45.14)

WHEREAS, the Local Government Cap Law, N.J.S. 40A:4-45.1 et seq., provides that in the preparation of its annual budget, a municipality shall limit any increase in said budget up to 2.5% or the cost of living adjustment, whichever is less, unless authorized by ordinance to increase it to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, subject to certain exceptions; and,

WHEREAS, the cost of living adjustment for calendar year 2024 budget is calculated at 2.5% pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:4-45.2 and amounts to \$307,173; and

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A:4-45.15a provides that a municipality may, when authorized by ordinance, appropriate the difference between the amount of its actual final appropriation and the 3.5% percentage rate as an exception to its final appropriations in either of the next two succeeding years; and,

WHEREAS, the Borough Council of the Borough of Park Ridge in the County of Bergen finds it's advisable and necessary to increase its CY 2024 budget by up to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, in the interest of promoting the health, safety and welfare of the citizens; and,

WHEREAS, the Borough Council hereby determines that an additional 1.0% increase in the budget of said year, amounting to \$122,869 in excess of the increase in final appropriations otherwise permitted by the Local Government Cap Law, is advisable and necessary; and,

WHEREAS, the Borough Council hereby determines that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in-either of the next two succeeding years.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED, by the Borough Council of the Borough of Park Ridge, in the County of Bergen, a majority of the full authorized membership of this governing body affirmatively concurring, that, in the 2023 budget year, the final appropriations of the Borough of Park Ridge shall, in accordance with this ordinance and N.J.S.A. 40A:4-45.14, be increased by 3.5%, amounting to \$430,042, and that the 2024 municipal budget for the Borough of Park Ridge be approved and adopted in accordance with this ordinance; and,

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years; and,

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that a certified copy of this ordinance as introduced be filed with the Director of the Division of Local Government Services within 5 days of introduction; and,

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that a certified copy of this ordinance upon adoption, with the recorded vote included thereon, be filed with said Director within 5 days after such adoption.

BOROUGH OF PARK RIDGE ORDINANCE NO. 2024-009

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING AND SUPPLEMENTING CHAPTER 80 OF THE CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF PARK RIDGE ENTITLED "PROPERTY MAINTENANCE"

BE IT ENACTED AND ORDAINED, by the Governing Body of the Borough of Park Ridge those portions of the aforesaid set forth below are hereby amended as follows and that those portions of the Ordinance not set forth below shall remain unchanged.

Chapter 80 entitled "Property Maintenance Article IX, Tree Removal" to be amended and supplemented as follows:

SECTION I. Purpose:

An ordinance to establish requirements for tree removal and replacement in Borough of Park Ridge to reduce soil erosion and pollutant runoff, promote infiltration of rainwater into the soil, and protect the environment, public health, safety, and welfare.

SECTION II. Definitions:

For the purpose of this ordinance, the following terms, phrases, words, and their derivations shall have the meanings stated herein unless their use in the text of this ordinance clearly demonstrates a different meaning. When consistent with the context, words used in the present tense include the future, words used in the plural number include the singular number, and words used in the singular number include the plural number. The use of the word "shall" means the requirement is always mandatory and not merely directory.

- A. "Applicant" means any "person", as defined below, who applies for approval to remove trees regulated under this ordinance,
- B. "Clear-cutting" means the removal in any calendar year of more than four trees or 25% of the trees on any lot in the Borough as depicted on the Borough's tax map or on or in any approved subdivision plat or deed, whichever lot is smaller in size, not on any Borough right-of-way.
- C. "Critical Root Radius (CRR)" means the zone around the base of a tree where the majority of the root system is found. This zone is calculated by multiplying the diameter at breast height (DBH) of the tree by 1.5 feet. For example: a tree with a 6" DBH would have a CRR = 6"x1.5" = 9".
- D. "Diameter at Breast Height (DBH)" means the diameter of the trunk of a mature tree generally measured at a point four and a half feet above ground level from the uphill side of the tree. For species of trees where the main trunk divides below the 4 ½ foot height, the DBH shall be measured at the highest point before any division.
- E. "Hazard Tree" means a tree or limbs thereof that meet one or more of the criteria below. Trees that do not meet any of the criteria below and are proposed to be removed solely for development purposes are not hazard trees. A Licensed Tree Expect to make all Hazard tree determination.
 - 1. Has an infectious disease or insect infestation;
 - 2. Is dead or dying;
 - Obstructs the view of traffic signs or the free passage of pedestrians or vehicles, where pruning attempts have not been effective;

- 4. Is causing obvious damage to structures (such as building foundations, sidewalks, etc.); or
- 5. Is determined to be a threat to public health, safety, and/or welfare by a certified arborist or Licensed Tree Expert (LTE).
- F. "Person" means any individual, resident, corporation, utility, company, partnership, firm, or association.
- G. "Planting strip" means the part of a street right-of-way between the public right-of-way and the portion of the street reserved for vehicular traffic or between the abutting property line and the curb or traveled portion of the street, exclusive of any sidewalk.
- H. "Resident" means an individual who resides on the residential property or contractor hired by the individual who resides on the residential property where a tree(s) regulated by this ordinance is removed or proposed to be removed.
- I. "Street Tree" means a tree planted in the sidewalk, planting strip, and/or in the public right-of-way adjacent to the portion of the street reserved for vehicular traffic. This also includes trees planted in planting strips within the roadway right-of-way, i.e., islands, medians, pedestrian refuges.
- J. "Tree" means a woody perennial plant, typically having a single stem or trunk growing to a considerable height and bearing lateral branches at some distance from the ground.
- K. "Tree Caliper" means the diameter of the trunk of a young tree, measured six (6) inches from the soil line. For young trees whose caliper exceeds four (4) inches, the measurement is taken twelve (12) inches above the soil line.
- L. "Tree removal" means to kill or to cause irreparable damage that leads to the decline and/or death of a tree. This includes, but is not limited to, excessive pruning, application of substances that are toxic to the tree, over-mulching or improper mulching, and improper grading and/or soil compaction within the critical root radius around the base of the tree that leads to the decline and/or death of a tree. Removal does not include responsible pruning and maintenance of a tree, or the application of treatments intended to manage invasive species.

SECTION III. Regulated Activities:

- A. Application for clear-cutting permit: Applications for permission to clear-cut a lot are to be filed with the Zoning Office and will state the information requested on the application, including:
 - 1. The applicant's name, address, and telephone number.
 - 2. The address, block and lot number, and location of the property.
 - 3. A site plan or survey of the property showing the location of the trees proposed to be cut.
 - The applicant also will use visible weatherproof markings on the trees proposed to be cut, provided that no paint or chemicals that are harmful to the trees are used.
 - 5. An application fee in the amount of \$50 to be paid upon the filing of an application under this article.

B. Review of applications

The Zoning Officer will grant or deny any application filed under this article within 30 days of the receipt of the application and fee, unless the applicant consents to an extension. If no action is taken by the Zoning Officer within this time period, then the application will be deemed denied. Any application for clear cutting will be reviewed by the Zoning Officer and will be granted or denied on written notice sent to the

applicant at the address stated in the application. The Zoning Officer may request comment on the application from the other Borough employees, Construction Official, Green Team, Shade Tree Committee, Borough Planner, and/or Borough Engineer.

C. Tree Replacement Requirements

- Any person who removes one or more street tree(s) with a DBH of 8" or more, unless exempt under Section IV, shall be subject to the requirements of the Tree Replacement Requirements Table below.
- Any person, who removes one or more tree(s), as defined as Tree removal, with a DBH of 8" or more per acre, unless otherwise detailed under Section IV, shall be subject to the requirements of the Tree Replacement Requirements Table.

The species type and diversity of replacement trees shall be in accordance with Appendix A

Replacement tree(s) shall:

- 1. Be replaced in kind with a tree that has an equal or greater DBH than tree removed <u>or</u> meet the Tree Replacement Criteria in the table below;
- 2. Be planted within twelve (12) months of the date of removal of the original tree(s) or at an alternative date specified by the municipality;
- 3. Be monitored by the applicant for a period of two (2) years to ensure their survival and shall be replaced as needed within twelve (12) months; and
- Shall not be planted in temporary containers or pots, as these do not count towards tree replacement requirements.

Tree Replacement Requirements Table:

D. Replacement Alternatives:

- 1. If the municipality determines that some or all required replacement trees cannot be planted on the property where the tree removal activity occurred, then the applicant shall do one of the following:
 - a. Plant replacement trees in a separate area(s) approved by the municipality.
 - b. Pay a fee of \$500.00 per tree removed. This fee shall be placed into a fund dedicated to tree planting and continued maintenance of the trees.

SECTION IV. Exemptions:

All persons shall comply with the tree replacement standard outlined above, except in the cases detailed below. Proper justification shall be provided, in writing, to the municipality by all persons claiming an exemption. Proper justification shall be made by a NJ licensed tree expert as per NJ Statue 45:15C-11 or arborist.

- A. Residents who remove less than four (4) trees per acre that fall into category 1, 2, or 3 of the Tree Replacement Requirements Table within a five-year period. [The number of trees removed is a rolling count across a five-year period. For example, if 3 trees from category 1 are removed in July 2023, the 'count' resets to zero in July 2028. However, if 1 tree from category 1 is removed in July 2023 and another in July of 2025 the first tree will come off the count in July 2028 and the second in July 2030.]
- B. Tree farms in active operation, nurseries, fruit orchards, and garden centers;
- C. Properties used for the practice of silviculture under an approved forest stewardship or woodland management plan that is active and on file with the municipality;
- D. Any trees removed as part of a municipal or state decommissioning plan. This exemption only includes trees planted as part of the construction and predetermined to be removed in the decommissioning plan.
- E. Any trees removed pursuant to a New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection (NJDEP) or U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) approved environmental clean-up, or NJDEP approved habitat enhancement plan;
- F. Approved game management practices, as recommended by the State of New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection, Division of Fish, Game and Wildlife;
- G. Hazard trees may be removed with no fee or replacement requirement.

SECTION V. Enforcement:

This ordinance shall be enforced by the Zoning Officer.

SECTION VI. Violations and Penalties:

The Borough's Zoning Officer will enforce this article. For violation of this article, there shall be a fine of \$250. Each tree that is cut in violation of this article shall be a considered a separate violation. In addition to fines, the Zoning Officer may require implementation of any remedial measures recommended by the Borough Engineer and/or Borough Planner to correct the violations of this article.

SECTION VII. Severability:

Each section, subsection, sentence, clause, and phrase of this Ordinance is declared to be an independent section, subsection, sentence, clause, and phrase, and finding or holding of any such portion of this Ordinance to be unconstitutional, void, or ineffective for any cause or reason shall not affect any other portion of this Ordinance.

SECTION VIII. Effective Date:

This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption and any publication as may be required by law.

BOROUGH OF PARK RIDGE ORDINANCE NO. 2024-010

ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF PARK RIDGE AMENDING CHAPTER 56 OF THE PARK RIDGE BOROUGH CODE ENTITLED

"ELECTRIC SERVICE REGULATIONS" TO ESTABLISH AN ELECTRIC CONNECTION FEE SCHEDULE

WHEREAS, pursuant to N.J.S. § 40:62-13.2, in addition to rates, rents, or charges, the municipal governing body may impose a separate charge in the nature of a connection fee upon the owner or occupant of the property being connected to the municipal electric distribution system. The connection charges shall be uniform within each class of users and the amount thereof shall not exceed the actual cost of the physical connection plus an amount representing a fair payment towards the cost of the system and computed as set forth therein;

WHEREAS, the Board of Public Works of the Borough of Park Ridge have recommended that the Borough amend Chapter 56 of the Park Ridge Borough Code entitled "Electric Service Regulations" to include an Electric Service Regulations connection fee schedule; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Public Works of the Borough of Park Ridge have recommended a connection fee in the amount of \$2,262 per equivalent dwelling unit for new or upgraded connections to the municipal electric distribution system, which number may be adjusted upon receipt by the Borough of Park Ridge of the final results of the study performed by Lerch, Vinci & Bliss, LLP, Certified Public Accountants and consultants to the Borough in accordance with the provisions of N.J.S. § 40:62-13.2.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the Borough of Park Ridge, in the County of Bergen and State of New Jersey, as follows:

SECTION 1: Chapter 56-20 of the Park Ridge Borough Code, entitled "Connection fee" is hereby created as follows:

§ Chapter 56-20

A. There shall be an Electric Service Regulations connection fee established in accordance with Chapter 62 of Title 40 of the Revised Statutes of the State of New Jersey. This connection fee is in addition to the fees for department services set forth in Chapter 56 of the Borough Code. The electric connection fee is effective immediately and shall be:

(1) For single family dwelling units, \$2,262, and for each additional dwelling unit up to four dwelling units, \$2,262 per unit. For any multiple dwelling units in excess of four dwelling units, the BPW Engineer shall determine by accepted standards the number of units to be connected or added to an existing connection; where a unit equals an average annual consumption of 9,600 kWh.

(2) In the case of any building or portion thereof to be used for industrial, commercial, educational or other than dwelling purposes, the BPW Engineer shall determine by accepted standards the number of units to be connected or added to an existing connection; where a unit equals an average annual consumption of 9,600 kWh.

B. This fee shall, pursuant to statute, be recalculated at the end of each budget year and may be reset by ordinance of the Borough Council after public hearing, on a yearly basis. The revised connection fee may be imposed upon those who subsequently connect to the system in that budget year. The Electric Service Regulations connection fee shall be payable in full to the Borough of Park Ridge at the time a building electric connection permit is issued for connection to the municipal electric distribution system by the Borough of Park Ridge.

SECTION 2: This Ordinance shall take effect immediately following adoption.

WHEREAS, the Borough of Park Ridge has a need for assistance with the removal of dead or dying trees located within the public right of way along County roadways; and

WHEREAS, the County Executive, through the County's Department of Parks, has negotiated the terms of a new five (5)-year Shared Services Agreement (the "Agreement"), a copy of which is annexed to this resolution; and
