# MAYOR AND COUNCIL MEETING

# Mayor Misciagna read the compliance statement earlier as required by the Open Public Meeting Act, P.L. 1975, and Chapter 231.

- **I.** <u>Summer School</u>: Dr. Gamper expressed concerns the Park Ridge school district has regarding summer school and camp. Running camp would be very difficult with the new requirements and social distancing rules.
  - i. Councilman Capilli expressed his concerns about running camp responsibly while abiding the new guidelines as a result of COVID.
  - ii. Councilwoman Epstein seconded those concerns. She also mentioned how a majority of camp is based on field trips, use of playgrounds, field access and pool trips, which currently are not allowed and social distancing guidelines are hard to enforce.

A discussion ensued about the new regulations and current environment and the feasibility of the Borough and the School running a summer camp. Dr. Gamper would like the Schools and the Town to be on the same page and make a unified decision. The next BOE meeting will be this upcoming Tuesday where Dr. Gamper will report back a unified decision.

Mayor Misciagna asked about graduation and stated many residents have been reaching out to him with concerns and suggestions. Dr. Gamper said that this past Friday, May 8<sup>th</sup> the Governor's office issued clarifications stating that in person graduations are not allowed. Notification was sent to the parents from the schools. Dr. Gamper said they are trying to come up with creative graduation ideas within the new guidelines and Mayor Misciagna said however the town can help to keep us posted.

➤ Dr. Gamper inquired about opening school track and the status of our Borough Parks. Mayor Misciagna informed they are opened for passive recreation, but playgrounds are still required to be closed.

Opened Work Session adjourned to Closed Session at 7:10pm Opened Work Session reconvened at 7:45pm

#### II. Engineer Report

#### 1. CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS

#### a. PARK RIDGE COMMUNITY CENTER

Our office provided the Borough with our proposal for anticipated engineering services associated with the proposed ParkRidge Community Center on February 19, 2020. We respectfully request consideration and authorization for same.

#### b. 2019 ROADWAY IMPROVEMENT PROJECT

The project consists of NJDOT, CDBG and Municipally funded roads separated into two separate projects. CDBG/Municipally Funded roads and NJDOT funded roads. CDBG & Municipally Funded Roads: Project is complete and final payment is on the agenda. The CDBG reimbursement request deadline was relaxed from the original date of April 15, 2020 due to the current state of emergency. NEA submitted the reimbursement request.

NJDOT Funded Roads: The NJDOT funded roads includes Mill Road from Mallon Court to Pascack Road and has been approved by the NJDOT for construction. 4 Clean-up Inc. Remaining work includes curbing, milling and paving. The completion of the project is anticipated as soon as the weather breaks in the Spring. Additional work to be considered includes the Police Station accessible ramps on the east side of the building, heaved curbs along Broadway and various issues through the Borough. The previously submitted change order pricing has been negotiated to be applied as a time and material. A change order will need to be established to allow the work to be performed. The completion of the work is currently pending due to the current state of emergency.

- c. **2020 ROADWAY IMPROVEMENT PROJECT** The anticipated roads to include in next year's road paving program include Linden Avenue, Roland Street, Split Rock Lane, and North Fifth Avenue as well as any additional roads requested by administration. We met with Pete Wayne to review the selected roads and we are preparing a cost estimate for same to confirm how many of the selected roads can be included within the budget for this year's road improvement project.
- d. **PSEG GAS MAIN WORK** PSEG started work on 4/06/20 on their gas main work in the northeast section of the Borough. NEA shared a spreadsheet and map with the Borough to identify PSEG's work limits so that the Borough can select roads to be "swapped" to avoid half paved roads. This information should be decided prior to paving by PSEG. They anticipate paving late summer/early fall. There are no roads selected for the 2020 Roadway Improvement

Project that coincide with PSEG's work. Please note that with exception of moratorium roads, the roads that PSE&G work on will be left half paved by PSE&G.

- e. **INTER-MUNICIPAL TRAIL** The project was awarded to T.R. Weniger. A preconstruction meeting was held on October 21, 2019. Construction for the project was started in December of 2019. Completion of the construction is pending Suez/NJDEP final authorization. The contractor is closed for business due to the current state of emergency. They anticipate commencing construction mid-May at the earliest.
- f. **MEMORIAL FIELD TURF REPLACEMENT / REPAIR** Construction is underway. We are waiting on field turf sample materials from the contractor for review and approval by the Borough. We are working with the Borough Attorney to submit a conservation restriction required for the Freshwater Wetlands Transition Area Averaging and we are in the process of finalizing same for the Riparian Area restoration.
- g. PARK AVENUE COUNTY CO-OP PAVING/ADA IMPROVEMENTS FROM KINDERKAMACK TO PROSPECT Construction is complete. We will begin the process for requesting reimbursement by the County.
- h. **PARK AVENUE BRIDGE REPAIR** (**EAST OF BOROUGH HALL**) Engineering plans and specifications are complete. We will be coordinating with the Borough Clerk on an advertisement date for the project bid.
- i. **ELECTRIC LAKE DREDGING NJDEP Grant Application** for Water Quality Restoration was prepared by Bruno Associates with assistance from NEA. The Grant Application was submitted on February 7, 2020 requesting up to \$9,578,000 in grant assistance. Wetlands and flood hazard area investigation and field survey work are complete. Final survey is complete. An NJDEP Pre-Application meeting to confirm the extent of required permitting will be scheduled. We respectfully request copies of title information for the Lake Parcel, identified on the tax maps as Block 1402, Lot 1 for purposes of permitting.
- j. **GLEN ROAD BRIDGE** / **CULVERT** The Bridge Rehabilitation / Bridge Replacements should occur within the bridge's service life timeframe which is early 2021. Woodcliff Lake submitted an NJDOT FY2019 Local Aid Infrastructure Fund (LAIF) grant in the amount of \$1,357,000. The application seeks funding to supplement the 2015 NJDOT MA grant already received by the Borough of Park Ridge. We met with the Borough Administrator, Woodcliff Lake Administrator and Engineer to discuss preliminary steps. We understand the Borough of Woodcliff Lake received a LAIF grant of approximately \$650,000.

### 2. GENERAL ENGINEERING

- a. **17 PINE DRIVE UNPERMITTED SOIL MOVEMENT** The DEP issued a Notice of Violation to the property owners and trucking companies associated with the unpermitted soil movement.
- b. **MILL POND NJDEP DAM SAFETY ANALYSIS** The Emergency Action Plan and Operation and Maintenance Manual language have been updated. Final copies of the Emergency Action Plan and Operation and Maintenance Manual based on the minimal comments from the

NJDEP will be submitted. The inundation mapping remains to be completed. The NJDEP has indicated via phone conversations that once the inundation mapping is approved, they will require fully updated inundation mapping with new hydraulic studies.
