One of the first symptoms they are now saying is, "you lose your sense of smell and taste". I am going to just continue to ask people to stay indoors. Keep the social distancing practice going. This is going to last weeks - and we will have other cases, that's a certainty. It's nothing to be fearful about - just be vigilant and we will keep this down to a minimum. More than 80% of the people that come up with it - they survive, and there are no issues. We will get through this. I want everybody to keep a good thought for our County Executive, Jim Tedesco, who is quarantined. Say a little prayer that he tests negative, as well. And, the last thing that I just want to say is that I have heard more people saying that, "this is our new normal". I just want to say, "this is not the new normal". This is just something that we have to endure. It's like a miserable root canal. We are going to have to grit down and take it, but we will get back to normal. This is not the new normal, this is going to be hopefully a couple of months and we will be back to normal. Let's just all be vigilant. If you have any concerns, or if you have any issues, please call the Borough and we will put you in contact with the proper people. Anybody from the Council have anything else they want to add to that? Nobody, okay. I will stay in touch with everybody including both the Council and the public.
