I. <u>Engineer's Report submitted by Dan Lee</u>:

CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS

a. 2019 ROADWAY IMPROVEMENT PROJECT: The project consists of NJDOT, CDBG and Municipally funded roads separated into two separate projects.CDBG/Municipally Funded roads and NJDOT funded roads.

CDBG & Municipally Funded Roads: CDBG funded roads include: Woodland, Terrace and Oakland Streets and Municipally funded roads include: Bari Lane, Vitmar Place, Grobel Place, Capri Terrace and Knoll Drive and alternates Orchard Road, Wortendyke Road and Clayton Court. Project is complete and final payment to D&L Paving is being processed.

NJDOT Funded Roads: The NJDOT funded roads includes Mill Road from Mallon Court to Pascack Road and has been approved by the NJDOT for construction. 4 Clean-up Inc. Test pit work started October 18, 2019 with full construction to follow. Additional work to be considered includes the Police Station accessible ramps on the east side of the building, heaved curbs along Broadway and various issues through the Borough.

- <u>b.INTER-MUNICIPAL TRAIL</u> The Borough of Woodcliff Lake is taking the lead on the design, bid, award and construction management of the project. NEA is also the Borough Engineer in Woodcliff Lake. A pre-construction meeting is scheduled for October 21, 2019.
- **c.** PARK AVENUE COUNTY CO-OP PAVING/ADA IMPROVEMENTS FROM KINDERKAMACK TO PROSPECT We are coordinating with Cifelli Brothers for a preconstruction meeting the week of October 21, 2019. The project includes reconstruction of selected ADA curb ramps along Park Avenue between Kinderkamack Road and Prospect Avenue as well as a new crosswalk at the intersection of Highview Avenue and Park Avenue. Work is anticipated to start early November.
- <u>d. SULAK LANE BASKETBALL COURTS</u> The project is complete. The final reimbursement request from Bergen County Open Space was requested on October 18, 2019.
- **e. MEMORIAL FIELD TURF REPLACEMENT / REPAIR** The plans have been revised to accommodate an NFHS regulation field. Bergen County Soils Conservation District and NJDEP application documents were submitted on October 14 and October 18, 2019 respectively. The Borough's desire to purchase the ancillary field equipment (soccer goals, lacrosse goals, etc.) requires Borough attention. See grant status below.
- **<u>f. PARK AVENUE BRIDGE REPAIR</u>** (EAST OF BOROUGH HALL) Engineering plans and specifications are complete. We will be coordinating with the Borough Clerk on an advertisement date for the project bid.
- **g. ELECTRIC LAKE DREDGING** Wetlands and flood hazard area investigation and field survey work are complete. Final survey is complete. An NJDEP Pre-Application meeting to confirm the extent of required permitting will be scheduled. We respectfully request copies of title information for the Lake Parcel, identified on the tax maps as Block 1402, Lot 1 for purposes of permitting.
- <u>h. FY 2020 MUNICIPAL AID GRANT SOLICITATION</u>—With assistance from NEA, Bruno Associates submitted a grant application on July 16, 2019 for the 2020 road program including Linden Avenue, Roland Street, and Split Rock Lane. Grant awards are expected late fall/early winter 2019.
- <u>i. 2020 ROADWAY IMPROVEMENT PROJECT</u>—The anticipated roads to include in next years road paving program include Linden Avenue, Roland Street, Split Rock Lane, and North Fifth Avenue (FY2019 NJDOT Funded) pending award of grant funds from the NJDOT for the FY2020 NJDOT Grant Application.
- **<u>i. GLEN ROAD BRIDGE / CULVERT</u>** The Bridge Rehabilitation / Bridge Replacements should occur within the bridge's service life timeframe which is early 2021. Woodcliff Lake submitted an NJDOT FY2019 Local Aid Infrastructure Fund (LAIF) grant in the amount of \$1,357,000. The application seeks funding to supplement the 2015 NJDOT MA grant already received by the Borough of Park Ridge.

2. GENERAL ENGINEERING

- **a.** <u>17 PINE DRIVE UNPERMITTED SOIL MOVEMENT</u> NEA attended a meeting with the Borough Construction Official, property owners and the NJDEP Land Use Enforcement on September 4, 2019. NEA has not received an official determination from the NJDEP on enforcement requirements. The property owner confirmed soil testing was performed on September 20, 2019. Results of said testing is pending.
- **b.** NJDEP FLOOD DAMAGE PREVENTION ORDINANCE In accordance with NJDEP requirements, the draft ordinance was submitted to the NJDEP on July 8, 2019. The ordinance is pending adoption with the Borough.
- **c. ROAD OPENING PERMIT ORDINANCE** NEA met with Borough Personnel and the Borough Attorney to discuss potential revisions to the Borough Ordinance for Road Opening Permits. NEA will provide markups of the Road Opening Permit Application form and provide to the Building Department and Borough Attorney for further review and processing.
- **d.** <u>MILL POND NJDEP DAM SAFETY ANALYSIS</u> The Emergency Action Plan and Operation and Maintenance Manual language have been updated. Final copies of the Emergency Action Plan and Operation and Maintenance Manual based on the minimal comments from the NJDEP will be submitted. The inundation mapping remains to be completed. The NJDEP has indicated via phone conversations that once the inundation mapping is approved, they will require fully updated inundation mapping with new hydraulic studies.

- II. <u>Bike Run/ Car Show</u>: Councilman Farinaro stated that the Tattoo Parlor would like to do a second annual bike run and car show and are looking to do it on June 14th with a rain date of June 28th
- **III.** <u>Council Chambers:</u> Councilman Ferguson spoke about the two quotes that were obtained with lowest one being for \$16,400 for removal of panel molding, install new

beadboard, remove paneling and countertop. New counter tops etc. council discussed updates to the Council Chamber which would not include the ceiling, carpet or new flooring. A Discussion ensued. The Council is in favor of putting a resolution on to start the renovations.

- **IV.** Best Practice and Corrective Action Plan: The Borough CFO spoke about the submitted Best Practice and how the Borough passed with a 40.5 and no state aid will be withheld. Out of the 7 actions addressed in the audit and the corrective action plan, 4 have been addressed already. Bond rating will not be effected.
- V. <u>Utility Rates</u>: Councilman Mintz spoke about the utility board water consumption and how it is down and that they might be recommending a rate increase. He will be attending the November 6th meeting and report back.
