PROCLAMATION CELEBRATE ARBOR DAY

WHEREAS, in 1872, J. Sterling Morton proposed to the Nebraska Board of Agriculture that a special day be set aside for the planting of trees; and

WHEREAS, this holiday, called Arbor Day, was first observed with the planting of more than a million trees in Nebraska; and

WHEREAS, Arbor Day is now observed throughout the nation and the world; and

WHEREAS, trees can reduce the erosion of our precious topsoil by wind and water, cut heating and cooling costs, moderate the temperature, clean the air, produce life-giving oxygen, and provide habitat for wildlife; and

WHEREAS, trees are a renewable resource giving us paper, wood for our homes, fuel for our fires and countless other wood products; and

WHEREAS, trees in our town increase property values, enhance the economic vitality of business areas, and beautify our community; and

WHEREAS, trees, wherever they are planted, are a source of joy and spiritual renewal.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Keith J. Misciagna, Mayor of the Borough of Park Ridge, do hereby proclaim April 26th as Arbor Day in the Borough of Park Ridge, and I urge all citizens to celebrate Arbor Day and to support efforts to protect our trees and woodlands; and

PUBLIC PRIVILEGE OF THE FLOOR:

Mayor Misciagna asks if anyone present wishes to be heard on any matter.

Upon recognition by the Mayor, the person shall proceed to the floor and give his/her name and address in an audible tone of voice for the records. Unless further time is granted by the Council, he/she shall limit his/her statement to five (5) minutes. Statements shall be addressed to the Council as a body and not to any member thereof. No person, other than the person having the floor, shall be permitted to enter into any discussion, without recognition by the Mayor.

Speaker #1 – Carinne Murphy – 226 Doxey Drive: I would just like to make the Mayor & Council aware of two things – they are actually interrelated. Homelessness as well as food insecurity in New Jersey, particularly in Bergen County. My daughter has a registered N.J. 501c3 relating to homelessness and food insecurity.

I wanted to give you some details on **Homelessness** – Some statistics:

*In the U.S. - between 2017 and 2018, homelessness increased slightly by 3% which included 1,834 people.

*Homelessness in U.S. – A total of 500,830 people were experiencing homelessness on a single night in 2018.

These statistics come from the National Alliance to End Homelessness:

*In New Jersey – Statewide – 9,398 are homeless on any given night. That's 10 homeless people per 10,000 people in N.J.

*In the U.S. and in N.J., the greatest population of homeless people by race is Caucasian. The next largest group is Black or African American people. For homelessness, for the very first time in 2019 there was a 1st hearing on homelessness by the House Financial Service Committee.

*It took until 2019 to have Congress discuss the issue of homelessness in our country. This happened due to the rates increasing – it dropped down in the 80's and during the recent recession in the 2000's, it greatly increased.

Food Insecurity – Statistics come from the U.S. Dept of Agriculture:

*11.8% of people, which comes to about 15,000,000 people of U.S. households, were food insecure at some time during 2017

*Low food insecurity – have just enough food but never know where your next meal is coming from. According to statistics, in 2017, this level included 9,300,000 people.

*In 2016, the State total in N.J. of food insecure people, based on censuses, is about 900,000 and in Bergen County was 70,200.

*Across the U.S. we have poverty, hunger and homelessness including right here in our local community.

*We have activists and advocates helping to make a real solution to end hunger and homelessness.

*One of these people happens to be my daughter, Gia, and she will speak next to tell you a little about her registered N.J. 501c3

Speaker #2 – Gia Murphy – 226 Doxey Drive: I am 8 years old. I have a registered N.J. 501c3. I sell my arts and crafts – all the profits go to the homeless and to the food insecure. So far my company has donated to the local Food Pantry, Domestic Violence Research Center and the Covenant Homeless Shelter. I have placed some of the items for sale on the back table.

Councilman Mintz: How long have you had this going?

Gia Murphy: Since I was 6 years old – it all started at the Pancake Restaurant. I was in Nashville, Tennessee on vacation, I was there and I saw a lot of homeless people. While waiting on a long line at the restaurant, I decided to make some pictures and to sell them to the people eating there. Most of everyone bought a picture. I then came up with the idea for starting the non-profit with the money that I collected.

Mayor Misciagna: That's wonderful! I commend you on that. That's a lot of work to set up a 501c3 – I commend you on your good work!

Gia Murphy: Thanks for listening.

Speaker #3 – Will Fenwick – 5 May Court: I was trying to find the Municipal Budget on the website. I don't see it posted up there.

Magdalena Giandomenico: There is a copy at the Municipal Building. We are still waiting for edits to include the Council vote from our Auditor, but if you would have contacted me, I would have been more than happy to send you a PDF version.

Will Fenwick: I know that they have it down at Borough Hall, I just wanted to know when it would be posted to the website.

Magdalena Giandomenico: When our Borough Auditor incorporates the Council's vote for it, it will then be added to the website. I do have a PDF, so anybody who requests it can have it.

Will Fenwick: Great, sounds good. Another issue – On April 1st, it was brought to my attention that the Superior Court in New Jersey struck down one of our Ordinances for being too vague. I was just wondering if the Council is planning on re-introducing a version of that Ordinance, at some point in the future to try and get it reinstated, or if they were planning on abandoning it altogether.

Carmine Alampi, Esq. – Judge Christine Farrington found that technical elements of the Ordinance was vague, in that it didn't comport with some of the National Code Standards for electrical service and the details of providing this service for larger developments. There were several challenges to the Ordinance, but the only one that survived, was the issue of vagueness and it was brought up by the Judge herself during the trial. She fashioned an Order that was more in keeping, with my understanding of the law, and we are restrained from enforcing the Ordinance as it's written, but we are authorized under the Order to script the changes and readopt.

So the Council and the Board of Public Works are working together and working with their Attorney, John D'Anton, to iron out those provisions. We look forward to readopting it at that time.

Will Fenwick: Okay. Lastly, regarding a couple of items that are in the Agenda for this evening. I noticed there is an Ordinance to amend the number of Lieutenant's and Sergeants. My question is – it's kind of vague in the Ordinance. Just out of curiosity, is the total number of Police going to increase in town or, is the number staying the same and just the allocation of hirer-ranked Officer's changing within that number?

Mayor Misciagna: That allows for there to be an additional amount of Officer's within it.

Will Fenwick: Okay. That was my reading but I just wanted to make sure. And then there is a Resolution awarding a bid for the Sulak Basketball Improvement Project. I noticed, which seems kind of unfortunate to me, was that there was only bidder that responded to the town's request for bids. I, myself, as I said being an Attorney, I've been involved in bidding on projects before for municipal items put out. I was curious to see what manner of advertising the town used in order to publicize this bid and get some feedback from contractors.

Magdalena Giandomenico: So, we advertise it through the proper channels of The Bergen County Record, with the requirement of the days prior to the bid opening. I can give you copies of the advertisements. I did have about 4 people that actually came in and left me checks of \$100.00 when taking the drawings and renderings for the bid. They were able to pick those up from myself at the Borough Hall and from Neglia's office over in Lyndhurst. I am not sure how many picked it up from Lyndhurst, but from Borough Hall, I know about 3 or 4 local contractors came in and paid the \$100.00 and received the copies of the plans. However, only 1 person submitted. I am pretty sure that it was advertised on March 15th and the bid opening was on April 16th. Don't hold me to those dates exactly, but from my memory, it was March 15th that we advertised in The Bergen County Record, both the roads and the basketball courts. And then the bid opening was on April 16th at 11:00 a.m. here at Borough Hall.

Will Fenwick: So it was just in The Record and no other newspapers or websites?

Julie Falkenstern: How many road bids did we get that was advertised?

Magdalena Giandomenico: For the road bids we received 7 bids that came in for it. You are required to advertise it in the newspaper.

Will Fenwick: But the town did not advertise it anywhere else other than the newspaper?

Magdalena Giandomenico: No – it's publicly written in our Agenda's.

Mayor Misciagna: It's standard procedure on all.

Will Fenwick: I understand.

Mayor Misciagna: You do realize that we want as many bids as possible.

Will Fenwick: Oh, of course, any town would.

Mayor Misciagna: We've been working on that project - trying to get that court repaired for ten (10) years. So, we are very excited, and we received a grant to cover fifty-percent (50%) of it and the numbers came in on budget, so we are going to proceed with it, happily.

Will Fenwick: Okay. Then this just peaks my curiosity, because I've dealt with this in the past at work - there was a tax certificate that was redeemed. I'm just curious - does the town ever decline to put any tax certificates up for sale and actually attempt to pursue enforcement of their rights on their own? Or, is it the town's policy to always put up tax certificates to bid, to third parties, as they are allowed to do?

Durene Ayer: I have a question - You mean buy our own tax?

Carmine Alampi: I'll interpret. The question is: Can we go ahead and foreclose on the open taxes in lieu of offering the tax sale certificates. It's usually not done that way, but we have the right to do that.

Will Fenwick: Does the town ever do that? That's my question.

Durene Ayer: Why would you want to do that? Why would you want to foreclose on a piece of property? It doesn't make sense for the Borough to do that. It makes sense for us to go out and have a tax sale for the property, so that we get the money in, versus foreclosing on the property being left the property, as is.

Mayor Misciagna: We are not looking to confiscate people - we just want to get paid for our taxes.

Will Fenwick: No, I'm not saying you should.

Mayor Misciagna: You're implying maybe if we foreclose, the town would get a chunk of property.

Will Fenwick: No, I'm actually not implying anything at all. I have handled tax certificate defense cases in the past, and at the last town council meeting, there was a similar redemption that was effectuated, and my only reason for asking the question was I was curious as to what the town's policy is. I know tax certificate issues can be extremely predatory for the people that buy them, and I don't think it's in the town's interest to do that, because you never want the town to be adverse to its own citizens. And that's generally the reason why most towns put them out to bid. But, I was just curious as to whether or not if that was the town's policy or not?

Mayor Misciagna: The town's policy is to be made whole on what it's owed in taxes and that's all we are looking to do. Alright, thank you, we appreciate it.

Durene Ayer: This Ordinance allows the Municipal Budget to increase up to 2 1/2% for the cost of living adjustment. The COLA for 2019 was 2 ½%, which amounts to \$252,000 for the Borough. The CAP also allows the Municipality to appropriate an additional 1% over the 2 ½% to 3 ½%, which would be an additional \$100,083. So, the Ordinance that's before you, allows us to exceed the CAP Bank by 3 ½%, or \$353,000, which we will not be using, in total for the 2019 Budget, but allows us to bank it for future years' use, if we need it.

Mayor Misciagna: That's a standard thing that we do every year, correct?

Durene Ayer: Yes, correct.

Mayor Misciagna asks if anyone wishes to be heard concerning the adoption of this Ordinance.

There is currently one, we have now allowed for two positions and the Sergeants positions have been expanded to five. So, the total of the Police Department grows to twenty-one (21) members including the Chief. That's the sum and substance of the Ordinance. The actual promotions or appointments, are not part of this. This is the organizational structure Ordinance.

REPORTS OF THE GOVERNING BODY

Councilmember Metzdorf: ABSENT

Councilmember Epstein: I would like to recap of our **Town Egg Hunt** that happened last week. It was a great success from the Recreation Committee. We had a great turnout, great

weather, and great support from our local businesses. We are looking forward to assisting and organizing our **Town Picnic** that's coming up, the first weekend in June.

Councilmember Ferguson: If anyone is interested in learning and getting to know the **PKRG** family, they are always looking for new volunteers. If anyone is interested, you can always get in touch with me or Howard Fredrick's who runs the organization.

Councilmember Mintz: I thought we were going to publish the **Budget** online so people could see it before the next meeting.

Magdalena Giandomenico: It is going to be published in The Record on April 24th and then it will be put up online. So, it is going to be published tomorrow. We do the introduction, it will hit The Bergen Record tomorrow. We always have the introduction, the Financial Debt Statement, the Annual Financial Statement – everything is listed under our "Finance Documents".

Councilmember Mintz (Con't): Finance – Last meeting the Budget was introduced and the public has an opportunity to review the Budget in its' entirety and comment, at our Public Meeting, on Tuesday, May 14th at 8:15 p.m., here at Borough Hall. You can get a copy here, as mentioned before, at the Borough Clerk's Office, and it will be posted online on the website at www.parkridgeboro.com. **Library** – The Library staff is putting together a "Welcome to Park Ridge" packet with information about the Town and Library services. Apparently, as people move in, they are coming to the Library to ask what the town has to offer. So, they are putting the packet together, along with the information that the Borough already has in place, and put a complete packet together for those interested. Finally, there is a **new Sharp Library Display Board**. It is getting trained and then we will have new presentation and capabilities for educational classes. Lastly, as we move towards summer, there is free passes and passes that the Library offers for the Intrepid Museum, the Guggenheim Museum, the Maritime Aquarium, Yogi Berra Museum, Mystic Aquarium & Frick Collection of Art. Please use this. The Library has those downstairs for an offering. **Pool** – You all should have gotten in the mail your little envelope to sign up for the pool. It's going to be hot summer! Get into the pool - get now while the prices are good. We've held our prices the same as we were last year. Finally, at the end of the week, you will see **ballot boxes** in the Borough Hall, the Library and at our various religious institutions around town. It's going to be a Senior Survey to check in with our Senior Citizens, anyone 60 years or older. Please fill out the survey. The Council is trying to determine the needs and wants of one of our most important constituencies, and we are going to use that information to see how the Governing Body can help our seniors in town. You will start to see those out and around town by this weekend. So, please fill them out.

Councilmember Farinaro: One of our local businesses in town, **Park Avenue Tattoo**, is going to **host a Charity Bike Run** on Sunday, June 23rd. They are going to run up to Bear Mountain and back. Then after the run, they are going to have a **Bike Show and a Car Show**. They are trying to raise money for two local charities. One is the Park Ridge Community Policing programs and the second one is the Tri-Boro Food Pantry. If you know anyone that would like to come out and support, you can go on the run or come down and see the Car and

Bike Show. Again, Sunday, June 23rd. You can stop in at the Park Avenue Tattoo and see Joe or call him at 201-746-9997, he will give you all the details.

This is something that he wants to do - he wants to help the community. He is going to fundraise for Park Ridge Police and the Food Pantry, so I'm hoping that everyone comes out to support this event. Again, it is Sunday, June 23rd, with a rain date of Sunday, June 30th.

Council President Capilli: ABSENT

Mayor Misciagna for Councilmember Metzdorf: I would like to speak on behalf of Councilman Metzdorf on the **Tri-Boro Food Pantry**. I would like to **commend Gia** for doing all your good work. There are other people out there - the Food Pantry. We thank you for your support of the Food Pantry. We would like to get some of those watching tonight, to donate some food as well. We collect it at the Borough Hall, Library and other places throughout town. What they are looking for this month is toilet paper, paper towels, boxes cereal, juices, juice boxes, snacks, pasta, tomato sauce and basically, any donations that you would like to make. We are accepting the donations here and we will make sure that it gets to the Tri-Boro Food Pantry. Please keep on donating, because people really need your help. We want to do everything we can to help our neighbors. So, thank you, and to Rob Metzdorf for your continued support with that.

I would also like to mention that we have a lot of things going on this year. The main thing is on **May 15th, we begin our 125th year as a Borough**. Several of us up here, over the past few months, put a Committee together and we are going to do a number of events starting on May 15th - we will have a Proclamation. There is several other things going on in town. The Bear's Nest community actually turns 35 years old this year, the Pool turns 60 this year, and the Fire Department turns 100 years old this year, as well. We will mention and recognize all of those great partners in our town. We are doing a number of events, throughout the year, and it's going to **end a year from May 15th with a Gala**. We will invite everyone - we are trying to come up with ways to offset the cost of the event. This will be a black-tie event and celebrate 125 years in business. We have a great town - we have a lot of history. One of the exciting things; I've been living in this town a long time and I am learning more and more about the town. We have a young man named **Eric Johnson**, who I'm meeting with on Thursday. He is a student at Harvard University, and **doing his dissertation on the Campbell Brothers** who, once upon a time, had a Wampum Factory in Park Ridge. It is our hope that he will do some excavating on the site - maybe find some shells. Some of those shells actually made it on the Lewis & Clark Expedition, which to me is just amazing! This young man makes this whole thing very exciting. I talked to him on the phone - I'm looking forward to meeting him in person. The **Historical functions** will take place May 2nd and May 3rd of 2020. We are also organizing a **Taste of Park Ridge**. Everybody knows we have the best restaurants in the entire county, in our little town here, so we are hoping that we will have this event. We will be able to partake with our three great big restaurants, but as well, we will have Dairy Queen, our Butcher, and Leo our Baker, and several others - so, we are excited about that. We hope that we can raise some money for

this event as well. We will post these events as we formalize them. I'll have more to report in upcoming meetings.


