AUTHORIZE EXECUTION OF AGREEMENT WITH THE COUNTY OF BERGEN FOR THE 2018 BERGEN COUNTY OPEN SPACE, RECREATION, FLOODPLAIN PROTECTION, FARMLAND & HISTORIC PRESERVATION TRUST FUND HISTORIC PRESERVATION GRANT ACCEPTANCE

WHEREAS, that the Mayor and Council of Borough of Park Ridge wish to enter into a Bergen County Trust Fund Project Contract ("Contract") with the County of Bergen for the purpose of using a \$82,147 matching grant award from the 2018 Funding Round of the Bergen County Open Space, Recreation, Floodplain Protection, Farmland & Historic Preservation Trust Fund ("Trust Fund") for the municipal park project entitled Sulak Lane Park Basketball Court Installation, located in the on the tax maps of the Borough of Park Ridge; and

WHEREAS, that the Mayor and Council hereby authorize the Mayor and Municipal Clerk to be a signatory to the aforesaid Contract; and

WHEREAS, that the Mayor and Council hereby acknowledge that, in general, the use of this Trust Fund grant towards this approved park project must be completed by or about March 6, 2021; and
