Mayor Misciagna: As most people know in this town, the Mauro family have a long history of serving our community and it is nice to see Pete's son, Peter, joining the Volunteer Fire Department in his father's and grandfather's footsteps.

We will have an appropriate swearing-in ceremony, at their convenience, at a later meeting. We will let everyone know when that will take place and hopefully in the not too distant future.

## AGENDA CHANGES NONE

Mayor Misciagna: At this point of the meeting, we are having a few technical difficulties, but anybody wanting to call in, please call 201-822-3199 and the password is 121212 . You may call in at any time during the meeting.

## PUBLIC PRIVILEGE OF THE FLOOR:

Mayor Misciagna asks if anyone present wishes to be heard on any matter.
Upon recognition by the Mayor, the person shall proceed to the floor and give his/her name and address in an audible tone of voice for the records. Unless further time is granted by the Council, he/she shall limit his/her statement to five (5) minutes. Statements shall be addressed to the Council as a body and not to any member thereof. No person, other than the person having the floor, shall be permitted to enter into any discussion, without recognition by the Mayor.

Speaker \#1 - Will Fenwick - 5 Mae Court: My first question: The Hornrock/Sony Litigation had been adjourned. What is the status on the remediation/settlement negotiations?

Anthony Bocchi, Esq: The trial has been adjourned until November 18rh. The Council for Fair Share and the developer's instructed the Court that they would be sending a draft settlement proposal to the borough for the borough's consideration. At this time, we haven't received any draft settlement proposal. As of right now, the trial is on for November 18th.

Will Fenwick: There has also been some activity up at the old Sony Headquarters itself. There has been a large fence that's been put up and some construction equipment that's been moved in. Has a demolition permit been issued or any other type of construction permit been issued for the property?

Mayor Misciagna: No, there hasn't been.
Will Fenwick: So, is it the opinion of the borough that any construction going on is illegal or is improper?

Anthony Bocchi, Esq: My understanding is that there is no construction going on. The owners of the property obtained a permit to put up a fence, so they put up a fence. That's all that we know. My understanding is that there is no demolition permit, no permit has been sought at this time, no permit has been issued and there is no work that is being conducted pursuant to any demolition permit, that I am aware of, and that I know that the borough is aware of, at this time.

Will Fenwick: But, they did get a permit to put up a fence correct?
Anthony Bocchi, Esq: Yes, that is my understanding, correct.
Mayor Misciagna: What I understand, Will, is that the building is vacant now and they are concerned about kids breaking in and such. They are trying to secure the building to keep it safe.

Will Fenwick: I believe at one of the prior Council meetings, there was a contract issued, I think it was to pay an architect in relation to the Community Center. How tall is the Community Center going to be?

Julie Falkenstern: The plans are not finished yet, Will, but right now what we are looking at is probably a two-story building.

Mayor Misciagna: There is a gymnasium attached to it and there is meeting rooms and smaller break out rooms.

Will Fenwick: I didn't know if some of it was being set aside for some other use or in terms of with the developer of the adjacent property who agreed to put money towards the building... or?

Mayor Misciagna: No, it's all for the borough, Will. It's a borough facility - it's a Community Center. What we envision is children using it, we envision groups using it for meetings. Our senior's we hope will use it for their meetings. It will have bathroom facilities, there will be some areas for where we will be able to serve coffee and have food, that type of thing.

Will Fenwick: Okay. My last question is in relation to parking. That building is going to be erected on one of the commuter parking areas, is there going to be additional parking or some other way of replacing those parking spaces that are being lost to the building?

Mayor Misciagna: Yes, they are going to be in the new parking structure on the other side. We came to an agreement with the developer that with the spots that we are losing, by putting the building on half of the commuter lot, will be more than picked up in the parking structure on the other side of the tracks. The deal we met increased the number of spots and was part of the deal.

Will Fenwick: Okay, thank you.

Speaker \#2 - Burton Hall-98 North Fifth Street: There is no sign at the end of the Atkins Glen Park. There has been a number of issues where there has been people going through yards, and actually, challenging people in their back yards. I think it would save, especially in this time when if there is ever issues of break-ins, you don't need strangers walking through people's backyards. It would be very simple to put a metal sign saying, "This is the end of Atkins Glen Park", after this it's private property".

Mayor Misciagna: I didn't know that there was an issue, Burton, that's the first I am hearing of it. We obviously would be happy to identify the end of the Glen. Is there something happening that I am unaware of?

Burton Hall: Just a couple of things. I believe there was one letter that was sent to the town, but I have been there when people have challenged with people letting their pit-bulls running free. There has been people who are lost and really apologized and saying, "that I don't know where I am going, the path has ended here". It would be troubling if you have people, who you don't know who they are, and they are walking past people's houses. I have friends there and I have actually witnessed this happening. I think if you check with the people that this is an issue. I think it would be very simple to put a sign up that says, "Park ends here".

Mayor Misciagna: Yes, we would be happy to do that. I live at the Glen, so I know the area very well. I didn't realize that there was anybody trespassing. It goes very deep, so I am assuming you mean to put it all the way at the end inside the Glen area, right?

Burton Hall: It's at that part of the park where the property ends that you have people walking litterly past people's windows and houses and bringing their bicycles up. There have been a few people who have not been pleasant. It would save a lot of problems and also the liability for the homeowners.

Mayor Misciagna: Tomorrow, I will speak with the Police and ask them to periodically go in there to keep an eye on things. We will certainly put signage up, that is easy. So, we are happy to do that. I know Fred very well and I will speak to him. I didn't realize there were any issues. Thank you for letting us know.

Burton Hall: Absolutely, and thank you!

## REPORTS OF THE GOVERNING BODY

In closing tonight, I just want to mention that we are encouraging everybody to stay safe. We are seeing state-wide and nationally, an uptick in COVID-19 cases, and I want to encourage everybody to do that.

And, with that in mind, I issued an Executive Order to extend outdoor dining through March 31st. We have to help out businesses - it has been a rough year on all of our businesses, but particularly our restaurants. So, it is our hope that we can extend the outdoor dining, it keeps people in a safer environment - outdoors is definitely safer. We are working through these difficult times and doing our best to accommodate everyone. With that, please continue to socially distance, wear your masks and stay safe!

Borough Clerk - Magdalena Giandomenico: Election Recap: This year, voting in the General Election on November 3rd will be unique. You will receive in the mail a "Vote by Mail". If by chance you do not, you should call the County Clerk's office at 201-336-7000 to request one. You should send in your mail in ballot. Park Ridge will only have one open polling place open and that will be at the Park Ridge High School, in the gymnasium. Should you go to the High School, you will be voting this year by paper provisional ballot only. Voter machines will only be open to people who are disabled, hearing and visually impaired. Everybody else will fill out a paper ballot. Once again, the polls are open from 6:00 a.m. till 8:00 p.m. and will only be at the Park Ridge High School.

Mayor Misciagna: Just one last point of clarity - If you do have your Mail in Ballot and you have not mailed it in, and its Election Day, there is provisions for you to drop it off at that polling location. At that point, you will just have to sign some documents to make sure that it goes through and it will be counted - is that correct Maggie?

Magdalena Giandomenico: Yes, correct.

Mayor Misciagna: Thank you, Maggie. Please everybody - get out and vote. I think a lot of people have already voted, but we want to make sure that every voice is heard. So, please get out and vote - we have one week from today. I don't care who you vote for, but vote. It is our responsibility and duty as citizens. Have a safe Halloween and enjoy trick-or-treating. We will see you in a couple of weeks.
